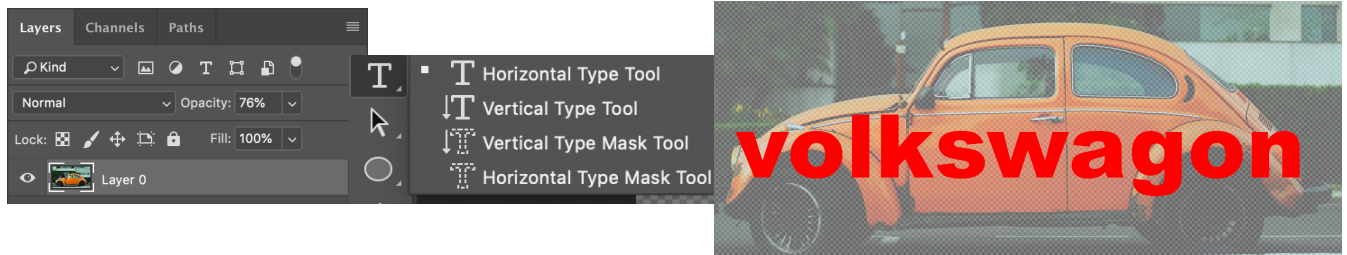


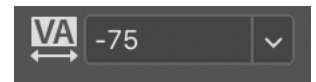
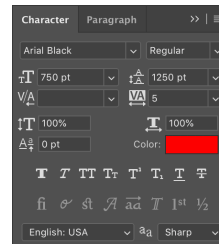
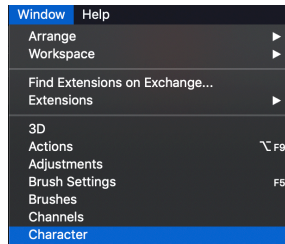
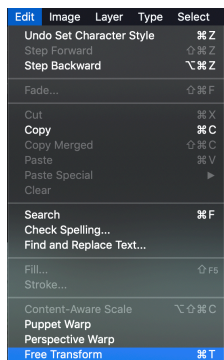
# Photoshop Typography II

## Filling Shapes with Text

Open an image in Photoshop. In the **Layers** panel, unlock the **Background** and lower the **Opacity** to make your type easier to see on the image. Select the **Type Tool**. Adjust font style and size. Type your word(s) over the object in the image.

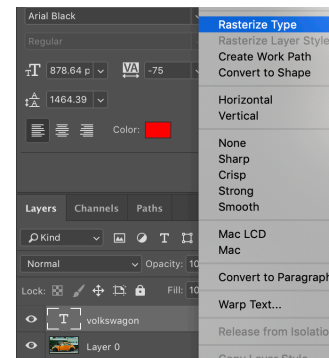


Select **Window > Character** to open the character panel. Adjust the spacing so the letters are close together.



Select **Edit > Free Transform** to set the size your text size to fit your object.

Then, right click your text layer and select **Rasterize Type** from the menu.



Select **Edit > Transform > Warp**. Pull on any part of the grid to begin shaping your text. Warp the text into the shape of your object.
